**September 10, 1939** Canada declared war on Germany, 7 days after Britain and


France. The first Canadian troops left for England in December. Although "obliged to go to war at Britain's side," King's delay of a week was a symbolic gesture of

independence.

**September 2, 1945** The formal surrender of the Japanese took place on the

battleship USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay, bringing the Second World War to a close. Altogether 1,086,771 Canadians, including 49,252 women, served in the armed forces.

Total fatalities were 41,994.



October 14, 1943 The Canada Medal was approved by King George VI and

the Canadian Cabinet. It was the first distinctly Canadian

decoration, although it was never awarded.

October 1, 1944 The 2<sup>nd</sup> Canadian Division crossed the Antwerp Canal to

begin the freeing of the Scheldt estuary and the port of

Antwerp.

October 20, 1944 After a fierce defense by the Germans under Gen

Hermann Balck, the allies captured Aachen, the first German city captured by the Allies in World War 11.




